Four students of the 72 enrolled in three semesters (Fall, 2017, Winter 2018, Fall 2018) did not complete the activity.

One section of DRA 180 is offered once per major semester (Fall/Winter) on campus. Except for four students who did not complete the activity, all enrolled students were assessed.

Each student completed short answer tests after participating in course activities consisting of reading scripts and supplementary course materials, as available, and attending various plays.

Met Standard of Success: <u>Yes</u>
62 students (91%) scored 70% or higher on the outcome-related questions.

7. Based on your interpretation of the assessment results, describe the areas of strength in student achievement of this learning outcome.

Students showed great strength in the area of recognizing major developmental movements in theatre. The data captures this strength based on the highest scores being achieved on questions #1, #2, #3 and #6.

8. Based on your analysis of student performance, discuss the areas in which student achievement of this learning outcome could be improved. If student met standard of success, you may wish to identify your plans for continuous improvement.

While still performing very well on questions #4 and #5 (earning an average of 5.2 out of 6 on each of these two questions) these were the lowest scores. These questions relate to recognizing cultural context within the major developmental movements of theatre; we will look at ways we might improve these scores, student success and comprehension in this area.

#### Met Standard of Success: Yes

59 students (87%) scored 70% or higher on the outcome-related questions.

Students averaged 21 points out of 24 for this outcome. This an 87% success rate.

Strengths: Students were strong in their ability to apply analysis to major components of theatre and demonstrated strengths in interpretation of these components.

Weaknesses: While the standard of success was met, the assessment process brought attention to a flaw in the outcome; one part of the outcome is not assessable in the context of this course. The outcome includes "staging" in "recognize and apply..." and while the students can recognize staging, they don't "apply" it in this course. This points to the need to reword the language of the outcome. The standard of success was met for this outcome and tool.

7. Based on your interpretation of the assessment results, describe the areas of strength in student achievement of this learning outcome.

Students show significant strength in script analysis, particularly when reading and attending the play is combined. Scores on these questions present higher. Students also show strength in the interpretation of staging and directorial choices. Students

were strong in their ability to apply analysis to major components of theatre and demonstrated strengths in interpretation of these components.

8. Based on your analysis of student performance, discuss the areas in which student achievement of this learning outcome could be improved. If student met standard of success, you may wish to identify your plans for continuous improvement.

The assessment process brought to attention the need for the outcome language to change. The students achieved the standard of success and demonstrated strength in the outcome; however, it was not possible to assess the "application of staging". This is a flaw in how the outcome is written, and the plan of action is to change the language of the outcome to improve it to better match the learning goals that are being achieved.

#### III. Course Summary and Intended Changes Based on Assessment Results

This course is meeting the needs of the students. The inception and design of this course was and is intended to broaden the understanding and appreciation of the collaborative art form of theater through the reading, discussion and attending of plays. The assessment results indicate that the design and implementation of the course is successful. In Outcome #1, the recognition of major movements and social context was strong when reading and attending the play. In Outcome #2, students demonstrated heightened comprehension in script analysis and directorial choices when reading the script and attending the play is combined. While not necessarily surprising, it indicates that this pedagogy is effective. This result will help inform refinement and expansion of what is working.
