75% of the students will score 75% or higher on the learning outcomes.

Two sections of the final exam were used to assess the students. The first was a multiple choice test that assessed their understanding of the basic concepts of the course and reviewed the representative objectives that were established. The second section included two essays that students were required to complete. The multiple choice test was scored using a scantron form. The essay exams were scored by other departmental faculty according to a rubric.

Students performed very well on the multiple choice section of the test. 100% of the 20 students who completed the exam correctly answered 75% of the questions. This exceeds the standard of success.

Students performed less well on the essay exam portion of the assessment. Nineteen students completed essays. In order to meet the standard of success, fourteen (14) students needed to score an 8 or above on each essay. Eight of the students scored an eight (8) or higher on the Vietnam Essay. This calculates to a success rate of 42%. Ten students scored an eight (8) or higher on the Civil Rights essay. This calculates to a success rate of 53%. Neither result meets the standard of success for this portion of the assessment.

Strengths: Students responded very well to the objective questioning. They were able to understand the concepts set forth in the representative objectives. They were able to correlate social, political and economic information to the objectives.

Weaknesses: Students were not able to articulate to the standard of success established for the outcomes. They were not able to analyze, integrate or synthesize the information within the framework of the written portion of the exam. In reviewing the essays, students were better able to name the events, but performed less well in explaining and connecting the event to the historical question.
